## **CLUB RULES**

These rules are not to contradict or breach any of the GCR's. These rules are to help members and officials to communicate and help the ride days to proceed efficiently.

Failure to follow the Central Coast Junior Motorcycle Club inc, Club Rules may results in having your membership cancelled.

**CODE OF CONDUCT:** All competitors, officials and parents are reminded of the Motorcycling Australia By-Law-**Code of Conduct** (as stipulated in the GCR's) which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all motorcycle meetings. This Code of Conduct applies to all meetings held by the Central Coast Junior Motorcycle Club inc, and shall be enforced. All members, family and friends are asked to arrive and leave in an orderly manner so that we do not disturb the neighbours.

★ SOCIAL MEDIA: Whilst we encourage the use of our website and electronic media to keep members up to date, we ask that members use good judgement, manners and common sense when posting and communicating on social media sites like Facebook, Twitter and the like. Please refer to the Manual of Motorcycle Sport-Motorcycle Australia Code of Conduct Attachment A; Member Protection Policy Appendix 3-6.9 Cyber Bulling/Safety and 6.10 Social Networking Websites Policy.

**SIGN ON:** All competitors machines must be presented for scrutineering before they are able to sign on.

**<u>SCRUTINEERING</u>**: All competitor's machines, back protectors and helmets must be presented for scrutineering after the rider has signed on. Scrutineering will be completed at 9.20am.

**<u>A</u> MACHINES**: All machines entered in a meeting held by Central Coast Junior Motorcycle Club inc., must comply with the GCR's for competition.

**<u> RIDERS BRIEFING</u>**: Riders briefing will commence at 9.30am. It is compulsory for all competitors to attend Riders Briefing. The meeting will commence at 10.00am. No machines are to be started before 10.00am.

**NOISE TESTING:** Random noise testing is conducted. If your machine does not comply with the GCR's, you will not be able to compete until it is rectified.

**NO RIDING OF UNREGISTERED MOTORCYCLES AT THE COMPLEX OTHER THAN ON THE TRACK:** This includes the pit area and the car park. The appointed officials may/will exclude riders not complying with this rule.

## \* RESPONIBLITIES OF PARENTS/GUARDIANS/VOLUNTEERS TO ASSIST IN THE RUNNING OF THE MEETINGS: Every

competitor must supply a parent/guardian/volunteer to help with the duties of running a meeting. The competitors volunteer must nominate a duty of their preference on the roster sheet at sign on. If you do not volunteer for a duty, you will be allocated one. If the parent/guardian/volunteer refuses to assist, the competitor will not be permitted to compete on the day. Below is a list of the following duties:

◆ INJURED COMPETITOR: The Medical Team of the day will determine if an injured competitor is able to compete for the remainder of the meeting. Under no circumstances is anyone permitted on the track other than officials and the Medical Team.

**ANIMALS:** Animals are prohibited from the complex. Animals that assist with a person's disability will be accepted. **PUSHBIKE & SCOOTERS:** Pushbikes and scooters of any description are strictly prohibited from the complex.

**ALCOHOL & PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES:** There is to be no alcohol and prohibited substances consumed by the

competitor, parents or guardian on ride days. There is to be no alcohol and prohibited substances in the pit area. If you are caught using either of these substances your membership will be cancelled and banned from the club.

TROPHIES: 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> trophies will be awarded as per point score. All other trophies will be awarded to riders who have done five (5) point scores meetings. CLUB CHAMPION: Class to have a minimum of six (6) riders for five (5) point scores. The Annual Junior/Senior Away Trophies will only be awarded to the riders who have the best results and compete under the Central Coast Junior Motorcycle Club inc., name and must complete 5 point scores at our complex for the year.
SANTA BAGS: To receive a Santa Bag, a rider must complete five (5) point score meetings. Competitor must attend Presentation Day to receive their bag.
